TEXT: Hebrews 2:1-10

THESIS: To show the brethren how to prevent drifting away from God.

### INTRODUCTION

- 1. One important thing any boxer needs to do while in the ring is to ensure that he stands and keeps standing throughout.
- 2. This is important because if he is on the floor, it is game over for him and a win for the opponent (enemy)
- 3. The apostle Paul described our Christian journey as a boxing (fight) that demands that we stand (2 Cor. 9:26; 2 Tim. 4:7; Eph. 6:13-14).
- 4. The Christian can however fall from standing and needs to take heed let he falls (1 Cor. 10:12).
- 5. The writer of the book of Hebrews admonishes the Christian to prevent drifting and falling away from the faith.
- 6. From the admonitions of the Hebrews writer, we shall consider three main points.
  - I. Do Not Neglect the Message from the Son.
  - II. Do Not Withdraw from God.
  - III. Do Not Forsake the Assembly of the brethren.

## **DISCUSSION:**

- I. DO NOT NEGLECT THE MESSAGE FROM THE SON.
  - A. Because of the one through who God has spoken.
    - 1. He is the Son of God (Heb. 1:1-2).
    - 2. He is superior to the Prophet as the Son (Heb. 1:1-3).
    - 3. He is superior to the Angels (Heb. 1:4-7; 1:13,14).
    - 4. He is God, the creator of all things (Heb. 1:8-12).
    - 5. Therefore, we ought to give more earnest heed to what He says (Heb. 2:1-4).

- B. Because of what happened to those who rejected what God spoke through Angels.
  - 1. God gave the first covenant and laws to Moses through angels (Heb. 2:2).
  - 2. Those who rejected and did not believe suffered various punishments (1 Cor. 10:10).
  - 3. They did not enter His rest because of unbelief (Heb. 4:2-6, 11).
  - 4. They did not escape the punishment so how shall we escape if we neglect this salvation which is greater than theirs. (Heb. 2:3).
  - 5. The punishment for those who will reject the Son is sorer (Heb. 10:29).
- C. Because apostasy is possible and dangerous.
  - 1. It is possible to drift away from the salvation we have received (Heb. 2:3).
  - 2. We can depart from God and lose what we have worked for (Heb. 3:12-14; 2 John 8).
  - 3. It is possible for a child of God to fall to sin and be lost (Heb. 10:26-27).
  - 4. We can drift away such that it becomes impossible to come unto repentance again (Heb. 6:4-8).

### II. DO NOT WITHDRAW FROM GOD.

- A. Hold fast to God and do not let go of Him.
  - 1. Drifting from God comes slowing unnoticed.
  - 2. We can only hold fast to something that we are close to.
  - 3. We must be diligent to seek Him and constantly pay attention (Heb. 2:1; 2 Pet. 1:4-8).
  - 4. Live intentionally as a Christian and work out your salvation (Phil. 2:12).
  - 5. Search the scriptures daily like the Bereans (Acts 17:11).
- B. Submit to God and draw near.
  - 1. We must humble ourselves and the Lord will lift us up (James 4:6,10).

- 2. We must surrender our wills to God and be obedient to Him (Heb. 5:9, Jam. 4:7)
- 3. We must draw near to God for that will make Him draw near to us (Heb. 10:19-22; Jam. 4:8).
- 4. We need to understand that beside Christ there is no sacrifice for sin therefore it is time to clean and purify our hearts (Heb. 10:26, Jam. 4:7)
- 5. There two best ways to draw near to God.
  - a. Talk to God regularly by praying (1 Thess. 5:17-23, Phil 4:6-7).
  - b. Let God talk to you regularly by studying His word (2 Tim. 2:15; 3:15-17; Psa. 1:1-6).
- C. Seek Him in faith and He will reward you.
  - 1. It is impossible to please the Lord without faith (Heb. 11:6).
  - 2. We need to imitate the cloud of witnesses who exemplified their faith by their works (Heb. 11:4-38; 12:1-3).
  - 3. We must show clear confidence and conviction in God (Heb. 3:14; 4:14-16; 11:1-3).
  - 4. Accept His chastisement for that is an assurance that we are His (Heb. 12:5-11).

## III. DO NOT FORSAKE THE ASSEMBLY THE BRETHREN.

- A. Assemble to stir up love and good works.
  - 1. We come together to edify and exhort one another (Heb. 10:25).
  - 2. We assemble to worship God and fellowship with the brethren (Acts 2:42-47; 1 Cor. 11:17-23; Acts 20:7).
  - 3. We must obey this command which also comes from the Son.
    - a. To forsake is to abandon, to quit.
    - b. To stop meeting with brethren is to disobey the Lord.
  - 4. We are called to fellowship and not to be isolated from the community of God's people.
- B. Forsaking the assembly is a lack of respect for the Godhead.

- 1. Where two or three are gathered in the name of Christ, He is present (Mat. 18:20)
- 2. When gather, there is the presence of our Heavenly Father, our Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit (Heb. 12:22-24).
- 3. Therefore, to forsake the gathering or come late is a sign of disrespect for God.
- C. Forsaking the assembly is a violation of the two greatest commandments.
  - 1. There two greatest commandments were stated by Christ (Mark 12:30-31)
    - a. The first is to love God with all our hearts, souls, minds, and strength.
    - b. The second is to your neighbor as yourself.
  - 2. Forsaking the assembly means we love some other things other than God and our neighbors.
  - 3. We become rude toward God and the brethren however Love is not rude (1 Cor. 13:5).
  - 4. We disregard the presence of the Godhead and keep the brethren waiting only not to show up.
  - 5. Will that fulfill the golden rule; do unto others as you want others to do unto you? (Mat. 7:12).

### CONCLUSION

- 1. It is possible for a child of God to so sin as to be lost.
- 2. The drifting may be elusive, but often by the time you realize it, it is too late!
- 3. For that reason, we must give "the more earnest heed" to the things we hear.
- 4. We are to be more earnest than those who heard the word of God spoken through angels (i.e., the Israelites).
- 5. We must submit to God and draw near to Him.
- 6. We need to be connected with God and the brethren by assembling regularly.
- 7. If you are a visitor, you can prevent going to eternal punishment by following these steps to salvation.
  - a. Believe the gospel (John 8:24).
  - b. Repent from your sins (Acts 2:38).
  - c. Confess Jesus as the Son of God (Acts 8:37).
  - d. Be baptized for the remission of your sins (Acts 2:38, Mark 16:16).
