Thesis: To illustrate to the brethren the differences between heavenly wisdom and earthly

wisdom.

INTRODUCTION

- 1. In the Old Testament book of Proverbs, we are encouraged to seek after wisdom (Prov. 3:13-18; 4:7-9).
- 2. Likewise, in the New Testament we are exhorted to walk with wisdom (Eph. 5:15-17).
- 3. However, James teaches us that there is more than just one kind of wisdom.
- 4. In this lesson, we will discuss three main points.
 - I. A DIFFERENCE IN THEIR ORIGIN.
 - II. A DIFFERENCE IN THEIR NATURE.
 - III. A DIFFERENCE IN THEIR FRUITS.

DISCUSSION

I. A DIFFERENCE IN THEIR ORIGIN.

- A. Earthly Wisdom is not from above (Jas. 3:15).
 - 1. It originates from the Earth.
 - a. It is worldly
 - b. Wisdom that is according to the world's standards
 - c. But this wisdom is foolishness to God (1 Cor. 1:20).
 - 2. It is sensual.
 - a. It is appealing to the senses, the emotions, and passions.
 - b. Wisdom according to what feels right but that doesn't make it right.
 - 3. It is demonic.
 - a. The kind of wisdom possessed by the devil and his angels
 - b. A wisdom that often finds its origin in the influences of Satan!

B. Heavenly Wisdom is from above (Jas. 3:17).

- 1. It comes down from God.
- 2. It comes through prayer (Jas. 1:5-8).

II. A DIFFERENCE IN THEIR NATURE

A. The nature of earthly wisdom.

- 1. It is full of bitter envy.
- 2. It possesses self-seeking in the heart.
- 3. This wisdom commends as virtues such qualities as:
 - a. Power
 - b. Position
 - c. Privilege
 - d. Prestige
- 4. It is this kind of wisdom that rebels and seek preeminent.
 - a. That prompted Satan and his angels to rebel against God
 - b. That prompted the disciples to argue over who would be the greatest in the kingdom
- B. The nature of the Heavenly wisdom.
 - 1. It is first pure.
 - a. Above all else, it is true to God's Will
 - b. Not one to compromise truth for the sake of peace.
 - 2. Then it is peaceable
 - a. Holding firm to the truth, it makes every effort to be at peace (Rom. 12:18)
 - b. For example, speaking the truth in an attitude of love (Eph. 4:15).
 - 3. Gentle.
 - a. That is, kind in one's dealings with others
 - b. Not harsh, even when right and dealing with those who differ (2 Tim. 2:24-25).
 - 4. Willing to yield.
 - a. Not in matters of truth
 - b. But in matters of opinion (Rom. 14:1).
 - c. In matters of liberty (Rom. 14:19-21).
 - 5. Full of mercy.
 - a. Quick to forgive the offenses of others.
 - b. Wisely understanding one's own need of mercy (Jas. 2:13).

- 6. Producing good fruits.
 - a. Notice verse 13, where it says we are to show by our conduct our true wisdom and understanding
 - b. This wisdom takes one beyond being a hearer to being a doer (Jas. 1:22)
 - c. Understanding that "faith without works is dead" (Jas. 2:26).
- 7. Without partiality.
 - a. Showing no respect of persons (Jas. 2:1-13).
 - b. Rather, treating all fairly, on the same basis.
- 8. Without hypocrisy.
 - a. Indicating that all of the above is not an "act", or a "show"
 - b. But that it comes from a heart desiring to please God and not man.

III. A DIFFERENCE IN THEIR FRUITS.

- A. The fruits of earthly wisdom are obvious.
 - 1. It causes confusion.
 - 2. It produces disobedience toward God.
 - 3. It produces every evil thing which are the works of the flesh (Gal. 5:19-
 - 21).
 - a. Adultery,
 - b. Fornication,
 - c. Uncleanness,
 - d. Lasciviousness,
 - e. Idolatry,
 - f. Witchcraft,
 - g. Hatred,
 - h. Variance,
 - i. Emulations,
 - j. Wrath,
 - k. Strife,
 - 1. Seditions,
 - m. Heresies,
 - n. Envyings,
 - o. Murders,
 - p. Drunkenness,
 - q. Revellings, and many others.
- B. The fruits of heavenly wisdom are better.
 - 1. It produces peace instead of confusion.
 - 2. It bears the fruit of righteousness, instead of every evil thing.
 - 3. It produces fruits of the spirit (Gal. 5:22-23).
 - a. Love,

- b. Joy,
- c. Peace,
- d. Longsuffering,
- e. Gentleness,
- f. Goodness,
- g. Faith,
- h. Meekness,
- i. Temperance and many others.

CONCLUSION

- Certainly, when we compare their origin, nature and fruits, the wisdom to be preferred is "Heavenly Wisdom"
- 2. What kind of wisdom do we have?
 - a. Those who have "Earthly Wisdom" boast of theirs (Jas. 3:14).
 - b. Whereas those who have "Heavenly Wisdom" show theirs by their good conduct

done in meekness (Jas. 3:13).
